

A Sacred Obligation - The 2020 World Zionist **Congress Election**

s Reform Jews who love Israel and care deeply about its wellbeing, we long for a State of Israel that is secure and strong — a democratic society that reflects the Jewish values of equality and chesed (lovingkindness) toward all of her

citizens and neighbors, whether Jewish, Arab Israelis, or Palestinians.

Yet we, as diaspora Jews, often feel powerless to influence decisions about various issues that have a great impact on both Israeli and diaspora Jewry. From conversion and marriage law to the funding of all religious movements and egalitarian prayer spaces at the Western Wall to rescuing persecuted Jews around the world to working toward a two state solution with her Palestinian neighbors, it can feel like there are few ways for us to effect positive change in Israel.

But there are! In 1897, Theodor Herzl, the father of Zionism, established a World Zionist Congress, a non-government body made up of 500 delegates from around the world to act as the "parliament of the Jewish people" to make certain we receive represenative funding so that we can weigh in on these matters and make certain our progressive voices are heard and heeded.

Every five years, elections are held for new representatives; every Jew over the age of 18 may vote and this is an election year! The 2020 World Zionist Congress elections will be held from **January 20 - March 21.** Our own Barbara Dudley has agreed to serve as our congregation's captain in organizing our voting effort. Voting is easy - it can be done online with an affordable registration fee of \$7.50 per person. We will provide the link and instructions just as soon as they become available.

This is one of the most important things we can do as Zionists and as Reform Jews to make our collective voice heard in our beloved Jewish homeland, which is why we are asking every Jewish adult in our congregation to cast a vote. Remember, when we post the link for voting, please cast your ballot for ARZA, the Association of Reform Zionists of America. Why? This is the most powerful way to ensure equality for the Reform Movement in Israel and to help us to grow our strength in the national institutions where we can ultimately make progress on the issues we care about: pluralism, justice, and peace. \$\prime\$


So, I'm asking, what can we do to make this happen? I'm ready to listen. I really love the Men's Club. I love the camaraderie. I think you would too if you would come to these events.



... Nearing the Finish Line!

etting goals gives you long-term vision and short-term motivation. Goals are like a lighthouse that helps guide you towards a destination. When you know where to go, taking the first step is less difficult; taking the hundredth step is made easier. Every step along the journey is part of the process.

The goals we set for the 175th Anniversary Campaign were twofold: \$1.75 million in current gifts AND 100 new gifts for our endowment.

Both are needed to help Ohef Sholom continue to make the positive impact We of Ohef Sholom have made in our community culturally, economically, and spiritually for the past 175 years. These goals have been our lighthouse, and have guided us on this journey, which has been one of the most meaningful parts of this effort. It has made reaching our destination and our goals, that much richer.

As Rabbi Lou Feldstein states, "Fundraising isn't about asking for money because the institution needs it, philanthropic partnerships are about providing people with opportunities to express their values and make an impact with their financial gifts." As a good friend, mentor, and professional fundraiser reminds me, "You're not asking for money, you're inviting someone to join you in helping change the world."

Thank you to all who have given us the opportunity to help you express your values, and consequently, help us reach OUR goals, changing OUR world for the better. You have made a difference!

We made the commitment last year, in honor of our two milestone anniversaries, to take the *road less traveled*, to challenge ourselves by embarking on a fundraising *campaign* rather than an *annual fundraiser*, to take the opportunity to proactively address our needs. We have not taken on an effort of this magnitude since the *Tekiah Campaign* over 16 years ago. We took a *leap of action*, *rather than a leap of faith*, and it has paid off.

To date we have raised:

\$1.6M and 75 new gifts for our Endowment (estimated value \$3.4M)



We still have a few laps around the track to go before crossing the finish line. (See Gift Pyramid) We still need your help. If you have not yet made a gift, or if you might consider increasing an already pledged gift, perhaps extending it for 3 or 5 years, we ask you to take a leap of action now. Gifts can be made online at ohefsholom. org/campaign, by mail, or by contacting us. Our hope that by the next printing of the Temple pOST Bulletin, March 1, we can announce we have reached our capital goal so we appreciate your taking action as soon as possible.

Success is not simply a matter of achieving our goals, more importantly, it's the meaningful relationships we have made, or rekindled along the way, the community building that has happened as a byproduct of engaging with our congregation to meet this challenge. We have realized success in so many ways. True success is really about creating excitement and enthusiasm around the impact you have made, and will continue to make, in our community, by your support of this effort. My hope is that we all can take pride and joy and reap the real rewards that come from giving: the feelings that come from knowing you are making a positive impact in the world by expressing your Jewish values.

Our gratitude and sincere "Thanks" to the 175th Anniversary Campaign Team, the dedicated and committed OST staff, the OST Board, Rabbi Roz and Cantor Jen, and our professional fundraising consultant Allison Bough who kept us on track and motivated! This journey has pushed us all to grow, and often that means out of our comfort zones. Please know that all your efforts and commitment to

this important journey, as well as your patience, are so appreciated. \$\phi\$

IN THE ARCHIVES WITH ALICE

A Tribute to the OST Archives

The Mollie and George Radin Archives is the largest repository of Jewish history and culture in this part of Virginia. That's not surprising since we are the oldest Jewish congregation in the region, the third oldest Jewish congregation in the state of Virginia, and the nineteenth oldest Reform congregation in the entire nation.

In addition to housing the records of this congregation since 1867, the OST Archives is the repository for thousands of documents, photographs, letters, recordings,

newspaper and journal articles, and manuscripts that chronicle the distinguished history of this congregation and the Jewish community of Tidewater. Additionally, the OST Archives contains artifacts that reflect our rich cultural heritage and spiritual traditions. It is an invaluable resource for congregants and researchers – including writers, filmmakers, educators, and students.

In order to record for posterity that history and those traditions, our Archives has preserved the annals of our congregation - including Board and Executive Committee minutes; Sisterhood, Men's Club, and Religious School files; membership records; and clergy and other personnel records. The Archives also contains several discrete collections. The SS Quanza and Exodus 1947 Collections document the history of those two vessels and the role they played in the

history of Tidewater and in world history. Finally, the Archives is also the repository for collections of personal and professional papers relating to individuals and families that have played important parts in our

past. These include the Rabbi Lawrence A. Forman Collection, the William Alan Goldbach and Family Papers, and the Bertram S. Nusbaum, Jr. and Lois S. Nusbaum Family Papers.

The OST Oral History Collection is one of our most important. It consists of recordings and transcripts of interviews with more than 70 congregants. It also includes recordings of panel discussions on a variety of subjects including the history of Temple Sinai, the impact of World War II, and Recollections of the Big Band Era and the USO. There are also interviews with members of Confirmation classes from the 1970s to the 1970s.

For me, it has been both a privilege and a joy to have worked as the OST archivist for the past three years. It is now time, however, for me to pass the torch to someone younger. I am retiring from the role of Archivist, but I will stay on as a volunteer, joining the ranks of the wonderful group of volunteers who have made my job incalculably less difficult and infinitely more enjoyable. To Gail Bachman, Ernie Goldstein, Karen Plotnick, and Margaret Sawyer, I offer my appreciation.

And it would be remiss of me to not express my appreciation for the knowledge and experience as well as the advice, support, and help of the co-chairs of the Archives and Library Sub-Committee, Eddie Kramer and Mark Friedman. Their guardianship of the OST Archives long predates my involvement and continues to be a guarantee that this amazing resource will be preserved. Over the years, numerous members of the Sub-Committee have also played a role in that guardianship and should be thanked. And finally, the Archives owes a

WHO'S NEW?

Meet New Members Linda & Eric Sherman



Welcome the Shermans when you see them around Temple!

ou might say the Sherman family in the Princess Anne section of Virginia Beach subscribes to the Crosby, Stills and Nash school of Judaism:

True to the words of the rock band's famous song, Eric and Linda

Sherman believe in "teach your children" – and that is the main role Ohef Sholom Temple plays in their lives as they raise their son, 13-year-old Alex, and daughter, 10-year-old Anna.

"Judaism is more than religion," says Eric, a director of customs compliance for Dollar Tree stores, headquartered in Chesapeake. Linda explains, "Our children need to know who they are. It's about traditions, family and history, and exposure what people went through before us."


Eric got an up-close view of exactly that in 1991, when, as an undergraduate student in international relations, he spent time in St. Petersburg, Russia – just after the cataclysmic collapse of the Soviet Union. Learning what he did about the plight of Soviet Jewery, he was motivated to volunteer with Jewish Family Services upon his return home. He helped tutor refugees in English while developing new friendships.

"People sold everything they owned and arrived (in America) with nothing," he recalls.

Impressing their children with stories of courage like that – and showing the kids institutions that embody their heritage -- make the half-hour-long trek from home in the southern Virginia Beach countryside to Ohef Sholom Temple in the heart of Norfolk worth it. The family recently celebrated Alex's

Bar Mitzvah and now looks forward to Anna's Bat Mitzvah.

"The most important thing to us is our children going



The story of the Shermans' landing at Ohef Sholom is not the traditional standard – but for this congregation it's not that unusual. Eric, originally from Boston but well-traveled as a youth, grew up in a Conservative Jewish home that emphasized Jewish ethnicity more than religious practices. Linda, originally from Sandusky, Ohio, was, and remains, Catholic.

Their spiritual homelife centers on celebrations of seasons and opportunities for family gatherings rather than to-the-letter observances of strict customs. "We celebrate the Jewish holidays the best we can," Eric explains. "We are always in search of a good Jewish deli, while Linda has mastered my grandmother's matzah ball (brick) soup recipe. Of course, my mom's kugel is a treat we always look forward to when the family gets together."

Until their children were born, religious differences mattered little to Eric and Linda.

But then ... when their children came along, they decided together that Reform Judaism was the religion deemed as the most comfortable for all.

"Ultimately, the kids will decide what they wish to be," says Eric, "but we want to give them a baseline."

And for that, Crosby, Stills and Nash's lyrics may offer assurance to all: "... know they love you." \$\phi\$
